Introduction

Welcome to the latest edition of the Hull CVS 'Your Guide to Local Grants' factsheet listing over 30 local grant schemes from Hull CVS, Hull City Council, the NHS, businesses and charitable trusts. Most of the grants available from these sources are under £5,000 with many giving much smaller amounts.

Our factsheet gives basic information on the aims of each grant scheme, how much can be awarded and how to apply. Contact details and websites for further information are also given where known.

Funders receive many applications from groups for projects that are either not eligible or relevant to their work - this can be a waste of time both to funders and to you. The golden rule is always to read the funders guidance or contact them first before applying.

This factsheet looks at local funding sources - there are also hundreds of national charitable trusts and funds. Our website at www.hullcvs.org.uk lists some of the more popular national funding sources you could apply for.

Community First

Community First is a government-funded grant scheme that will run for four years, until March 2015. Grants of between £250 and £2,500 will help communities come together to identify their strengths and local priorities in order to plan for their future and become more resilient. It will fund both new and existing community groups.

The programme is being administered nationally by CDF (the Community Development Foundation) and is targeted at specific wards. To deliver this programme local panels are being established in each ward to identify local priorities and identify projects to deliver against them. Panels are supported by a local charity or voluntary groups in their work. To apply visit the ward website or contact the panel partner.
